CHA's Sponsor Formation Program for Catholic Health Care prepares individuals for service as members of Juridic Persons to carry out the health ministry of the Catholic Church.

In addition to a rich grounding in the theological and canonical principles that apply to all sponsorship models, CHA's formation program offers participants opportunities for spiritual development personally and as members of a community who share a deep commitment to advance Jesus' healing mission in the world today.

Overview

OBJECTIVE

To provide a formation program for current and prospective sponsors of Catholic health care.

LOCATION

The program takes place at the Eaglewood Resort & Spa in the Chicago area, conveniently located near the Chicago O'Hare Airport.

FORMAT

The program consists of a series of four sessions in the fall and spring. Each session begins on Thursday evening and ends on Saturday morning.

Gatherings focus on developing and enhancing critical competencies for sponsorship through a combination of reflection, participant involvement, group interaction and presentations by nationally recognized ministry leaders and speakers. In addition, preparatory and follow up materials allow for additional learning integration.

CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPATION

Participants in CHA's Sponsor
Formation Program for Catholic Health
Care are selected by a sponsoring
organization that is a member of
the Catholic Health Association.
Enrollment is limited to foster
meaningful opportunities for reflection,
interaction, networking and learning
integration. Current sponsors and
persons deemed to have demonstrated
potential for possible service as a
sponsor receive priority consideration.
Other leaders of Catholic health
ministries who interface with sponsors
will also be considered for the program.

Curriculum & Timeframe

The curriculum weaves biblical, theological and spiritual aspects of the sponsorship ministry in a model that incorporates adult learning methods within a framework of ministry formation.
