Advocate for public policies and private action to stem climate change

Make climate change an agenda item for meetings

Never (or almost never) print e-mails

Offer expertise in your organization to others

Switch to low-flow shower heads and faucet aerators

Turn off lights and computers

Understand why this *is* a matter of faith

Visit facilities with good energy/ emission/waste reduction programs
