We are pleased that the Energy and Commerce Committee is making progress and urge you to keep the process moving forward so health care reform can be successful in the near term.

CHA and its members are committed to creating a health care system that ensures everyone will get the health care they need, when they need it. CHA's [*Vision for U.S. Health Care*](#) lays out the Catholic health ministry's principles for reforming the health care system. Central to our vision, we believe that health care should be:

- Available and accessible to everyone, paying special attention to the poor and vulnerable;
- Health and prevention oriented, with the goal of enhancing the health status of communities;
- Sufficiently and fairly financed;
- Transparent and consensus-driven, in allocation of resources, and organized for cost-effective care and administration;
- Patient centered, and designed to address health needs at all stages of life, from conception to natural death; and
- Safe, effective and designed to deliver the greatest possible quality.

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The 47 million individuals without insurance, the 16 million individuals who are underinsured, and the insured who have trouble affording their coverage are all counting on your continued effort to reform our health care system. For these people, the current U.S. health care system is failing. It is clear that fundamental, comprehensive reform of the health care system is not merely a financial or political issue, but a moral imperative as well.

Perhaps at no other time in our nation's history has health reform been so necessary and so possible to achieve, and I thank you and your Committee members for all of the work you are doing to provide meaningful health coverage
