## PHYSICIANS AND SPIRITUALITY

he relationship between medicine and spirituality has been the focus of considerable interest in recent years. Studies suggest that many patients believe that spirituality plays an important role in their lives; that a positive relationship exists between their spirituality or religious commitment, on one hand, and health outcomes, on the other; and that physicians and other caregivers should consider these factors in their medical care.
