Love of neighbor will no longer be for them a commandment imposed, so to speak, from without, but a consequence deriving from their faith, a faith which becomes active through love."

## **READING II**

Luke 10:25-28 (The New American Bible)

READER: There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test him and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

Pause for reflection.

LEADER: Let us pray together.

ALL: Lord of Life, open our hearts to our neighbors and their needs. May we continually grow in love and compassion, as we respond wholeheartedly to the call to serve in this healing ministry.
