## Catholic Health Association of the United States (CHA) urges our nation's leaders to unite and provide security and hope to those most in need through a COVID-19 relief package

Statement from Sr. Mary Haddad, RSM, President and CEO

"The Catholic Health Association of the United States (CHA) is deeply disturbed by the Administration's refusal to work with Congress to pass a critically important COVID-19 federal response package until after the election. Delaying the negotiations is unacceptable at a time when millions of American families face the expiration of unemployment benefits and struggle with food insecurity and missed rent and mortgage payments. While Catholic hospitals, long-term care providers and health care organizations continue to meet the challenges during this unprecedented time, this delay in passing a relief package will only cause preventable hardship for individuals, families and communities nationwide.

"Several weeks ago, we joined with national Catholic organizations <u>calling</u> for our leaders to come together for the common good. Understanding the gravity of the public health emergency and economic crisis, we were hopeful that the nation's elected leaders would come together on a legislative solution. The fact that the President instructed his aides to stop negotiating until after the election is a dereliction of duty that has dire implications for those who need emergency relief now.

"The effects of the pandemic will not wait until after the election, they need to be addressed now. The public health and economic crisis brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic continues to ravage the nation and the world. The decision to cease negotiations on additional COVID-19 relief will be devastating for individuals and families struggling to make ends meet, and the erratic and inconsistent decision-making of this Administration is causing unnecessary distress during this time of national uncertainty.

"CHA urges our country's leaders to put aside partisan politics and lead with compassion, to protect our most vulnerable and to provide security and hope to those most in need."
