Statement on Ending DACA

The recent decision by the Administration to repeal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) is unjust and immoral. More than 800,000 young people, who are currently contributing to America's communities and economy, are at risk of being ripped away from their families and subject to deportation. Some of these Dreamers have studied and worked hard to become caregivers and team members in Catholic health organizations across the country. They are part of the fabric that makes this country great.

The principles of our founders stress a commitment to justice and the dignity of every human being. We hope that Congress will operate with those same principles and act swiftly to protect these young individuals before the DACA program terminates in six months. This is very unfair to these hardworking young people and our entire country will be the loser if it is not reversed.
