The Catholic Health Association Expresses Disappointment with the Administration's FY2021 Budget Proposal

Statement by Sr. Mary Haddad, RSM, President and Chief Executive Officer, Catholic Health Association of the United States

WASHINGTON, DC – The Catholic Health Association is deeply disappointed with the Administration's FY2021 budget proposal. The proposal seeks billions of dollars in cuts to programs that Americans who are poor and vulnerable rely on, including Medicaid and nutrition assistance. The proposal also seeks to reduce funding for health care programs under the Department of Health and Human Services, breaking the budget agreement the Administration and Congress reached last year. Similar cuts are proposed for other vital programs that affect the health and well-being of millions, including the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

CHA believes that our nation's spending priorities should reflect our moral commitment to assisting the least among us. For the millions of Americans who rely on Medicaid and other health care programs, as well as housing and nutrition programs that promote healthier lives, cuts to these programs will have devastating consequences. Adding burdensome new restrictions on these programs such as work requirements in the Medicaid program will further restrict access to affordable health care. While we do commend the Administration's proposal to expand the mental health services available under Medicaid, that effort would only be negated by the budget's cuts and other harmful program requirements.

We can and must be better stewards of our nation's resources. CHA pledges to work with members of Congress as they begin the appropriations process to advocate a budget that meets the needs of everyone in our nation and assists all Americans in leading better, healthier lives.
