Washington, DC – March 23, 2020 marks ten years since the passage of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA). Thanks to the ACA more than 20 million people have gained health coverage and our nation has been able to dramatically lower its rate of uninsured. The benefits provided by the ACA are all the more critical today as our country faces the COVID-19 pandemic. Expanded Medicaid coverage for millions, protections for people with pre-existing conditions and covering essential health services are even more important as some of our most vulnerable populations face the risk of being affected by this pandemic.
