## THE CATHOLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION OF THE UNITED STATES STATEMENT ON PRESIDENT BIDEN'S INAUGURATION AND AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN

WASHINGTON, DC – "The Catholic Health Association of the United States (CHA) extends our congratulations to President Joseph R. Biden Jr. on his inauguration as the 46th President of the United States and to Vice President-elect Kamala Harris on her historic inauguration as the first woman and first woman of color to serve as the 49th Vice President of the United States. We look forward to working with the Biden-Harris administration and congressional leaders on strengthening our nation's health care system and unifying our country in efforts to address the unprecedented public health and economic challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"As our country mourns the over 400,000 lives lost to COVID-19, the pandemic continues to place extraordinary pressure on families and communities across the country. Catholic health providers are working daily to meet their needs during these unprecedented times.
