PATRON SAINT OF IMMIGRANTS, ORPHANS AND HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATORS

1850 - 1917

As we stop to reflect on our work to serve as a ministry of the Church, take a moment to listen to the story of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, a founder of schools, orphanages and hospitals all over the world.

As a child in Italy, Francesca Cabrini dreamed of spreading the word of God to the people of China. After training as a teacher, she was not received into her chosen religious order. The rector of the nearby parish, Fr. Serrati, saw great promise and sent her to make right a disorganized and badly administered orphanage. Although the orphanage eventually closed, Frances was not deterred and started an order of missionary women to serve at a bishop's request. With her fellow Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, they received orphans and opened a day school. The new order attracted many postulants and in seven years, Mother Cabrini, as she became known, had created seven institutions to meet critical needs.

A new opportunity came when she heard of the cruel situations for many Italian immigrants in the United

States. Although confusion caused financial issues, she and her sisters endured and secured funds to open an orphanage. Supported by Mother Cabrini's tenacity, perseverance and deep faith, she and her sisters opened 67 ministries of the Church including



schools, orphanages and hospitals, across the United States from Scranton, Pennsylvania, to Seattle and around the world in places such as Argentina, France, England, Spain and Brazil. Mother Cabrini became the first U.S. citizen to be elevated to sainthood.

Although she faced countless barriers to her dream of spreading the word of God — rejection from a religious order, lack of funds to serve those in need, dangerous travel — she persisted. Rooted in her deep faith, Mother Cabrini acted with boldness, audacity and creativity to ensure the longevity of Jesus' work.
